## INTRODUCTION

This is a list of Nearctic passerines that have been recorded in the Western Palearctic (BWP borders) and published in a WP national bird report, book of historical records, finder's account or national list.

There are a great many claims of Nearctic passerines that have yet to be assessed and published. Despite many of these having excellent credentials (including some supported by photographic evidence) they will not be included until formally published or recognised online by the relevant rare bird committee or national authority.

Entries are arranged chronologically by species. In the main they are Category A records, although some Category D and 'At sea' records are included. Apart from older records the majority have been published in a national rare bird report and are cited accordingly following the national ranking. When known, finder's accounts are also cited following the record's details with the full reference found at the end of each family section. The list of national bird reports consulted are listed at the end, beginning on page 194.

# SYSTEMATIC LIST

## Suborder: Tyranni

### Family: Tyrannidae - Tyrant Flycatchers

#### Eastern Phoebe *Sayornis phoebe*

##### 1. Britain (England) 1987

St. John's Valley, Lundy Island, Devon, 24th-25th April 1987 (McShane 1996). 1st British record (Rogers & RC 1993).

Originally reported as a possible Orphean Warbler, correct identification was not established until much later. Coincidentally one was claimed at Slapton Ley, Devon two days earlier, however it was not accepted by the BBRC (Hudson & RC 2011). Even though minor differences in their respective plumages was noted, it was possibly the same individual.

##### †. Britain (England) 2010

Tilbury Docks, Essex, 19th July 2010. Found dead. Not considered a genuine vagrant (Hudson & RC 2014).

#### Eastern Wood Pewee *Contopus virens*

##### 1. Azores (Corvo) 2015

Lighthouse Valley, Corvo, 18th-20th October 2015 (Monticelli *et al.* 2018). 1st Azores record (Tipper *et al.* 2019).

##### 2. Azores (Corvo) 2015

Poço d'Água, Corvo, 20th-21st October 2015 (Monticelli *et al.* 2018). 2nd Azores record (Tipper *et al.* 2019).

##### 3. Azores (Corvo) 2018

Coroa do Pico, Corvo, 20th-21st October 2018. Sound recorded. 3rd Azores record (Tipper *et al.* 2021).

##### 4. Azores (Corvo) 2020

Low Fields, Corvo, 4th October 2020. 4th Azores record (Tipper *et al.* 2022).

#### Yellow-bellied Flycatcher *Empidonax flaviventris*

##### 1. Britain (Scotland) 2020

First calendar-year, Balephuil, Tiree, Argyll, 15th-23rd September 2020 (Bowler 2020, 2021, 2022). 1st British record (Holt *et al.* 2021).

#### Acadian Flycatcher *Empidonax virens*

##### 1. Iceland 1967

Probably a male, Selfoss, Árnessýsla, 4th November 1967 (Kolbeinsson 2003). Found dead. 1st Icelandic record (Pétursson & Þráinsson 1999).

##### 2. Britain (England) 2015

First-year, Dungeness, Kent, 22nd September 2015 (Walker 2017). 1st British record (Holt & RC 2017)

Identification was confirmed at the University of Aberdeen following DNA analysis of samples of faecal matter.

## **Alder Flycatcher** *Empidonax alnorum*

### **1. Iceland 2003**

Juvenile, Kverkin Plantation, Eyjafjöll, 10th October 2003 (Kolbeinsson 2003). Trapped but not ringed. 1st Icelandic record (Kolbeinsson *et al.* 2006). This individual managed to attract a total of 14 birders making it one of the largest twitches in Iceland at that time.

### **2. Britain (England) 2008**

First-winter male, Nanjizal Valley, Cornwall, 6th-9th October 2008 (Wilson 2008, 2015). Trapped. 1st British record (Hudson & RC 2014).

### **3. Britain (England) 2010**

First-winter, Blakeney Point, Norfolk, 25th-27th September 2010 (McCallum 2010, 2015). 2nd British record (Hudson & RC 2014).

### **4. Norway 2016**

First-winter male, Hellesøy, Kvitsøy, Rogaland, 21st September 2016. Trapped. 1st Norwegian record (Olsen 2018).

Identification confirmed at the University of Aberdeen using DNA analysis of feather samples.

### **5. Iceland 2020**

Hvalsnes, Miðnes, Gullbringusýsla, 21st-23rd September 2020. 2nd Icelandic record (Sigurðsson *et al.* 2023).

## **Least Flycatcher** *Empidonax minimus*

### **1. Iceland 2003**

Juvenile, Stokkseyri, Árnessýsla, 6th-7th October 2003 (Kolbeinsson 2003). 1st Icelandic record (Kolbeinsson *et al.* 2006).

This bird flew into Jóhann Óli Hilmarsson's house where it was captured. It was examined and identified in Jóhann Óli's kitchen, held overnight and released the following morning in his garden.

An *Empidonax* flycatcher was photographed at Garður, Gullbringusýsla, Iceland on 20th September 2021. Although it was judged to be either an Alder or a Willow Flycatcher a specific identity could not be reached.

## **Western Kingbird** *Tyrannus verticalis*

### **1. Azores (Flores) 2018**

Adult, Ponta Delgada, Flores, 13th-14th October 2018. 1st Azores record (Tipper *et al.* 2021).

Contrary to what was stated in Tipper *et al.* (2021) the bird was not trapped and ringed.

## **Eastern Kingbird** *Tyrannus tyrannus*

### **1. Ireland 2012**

First-winter, Kilmurvey, Inishmore, Aran Islands, Galway, 5th October 2012 (Delaney 2012). 1st Irish record (Fahy 2013).

### **2. Ireland 2013**

Adult, Inishbofin, Galway, 24th September 2013 (McGeehan 2013). 2nd Irish record (Fahy 2014).

### 3. Britain (Scotland) 2016

Adult, Eoligarry, Barra, Outer Hebrides, 29th-30th September 2016, and, presumed same, Bornish, South Uist, Outer Hebrides, 2nd October (Saunders 2016, 2018, Saunders *et al.* 2016). 1st British record (Holt & RC 2017).

### 4. Iceland 2021

Suður-Bár, Eyrarsveit, Snæfellsnes- og Hnappadalssýsla, 20th July 2021 (Yzewyn & Ebels 2022). 1st Icelandic record (Sigurðsson *et al.* 2023).

The IOC recognise five subspecies of Northern Shrike, four of these are found throughout much of Asia but the nominate form is native to North America.

## Family: Muscicapidae - Chats & Old World Flycatchers

### ‘Greenland’ Wheatear *Oenanthe oenanthe leucorhoa*

Greenland Wheatear is the northeastern Canada, Greenland and Iceland form of Northern Wheatear, wintering in Senegal and from Sierra Leone to Mali. It is a spring and autumn passage migrant in the Western Palearctic. Autumn migration commences from late August and involves a southeasterly crossing of the Atlantic, with some flying non-stop from Greenland to northwestern Europe, before turning southwest for the wintering grounds, arriving there from October onwards. Spring movements begin in March and follows a similar route, but probably a greater proportion is made overland (Cramp 1988).

## Family: Fringillidae - True Finches

### Evening Grosbeak *Hesperiphona vespertina*

Adult male, Hirta, St. Kilda, Outer Hebrides, 26th March 1969 (Picozzi 1971). 1st British record (Smith & RC 1970).

Hung around just long enough for the finder to take a colour photograph, which confirmed the identification.

#### †. Norway 1973

Male, Krossnes, Onsøy, Fredrikstad, Viken, 2nd-9th May 1973 (Anderson 1974). Previously included in Category A (Ree 1976), later moved to Category D following a review by the Norwegian RC (Olsen 2021b).

#### †. Norway 1975

Male, Halten, Frøya, Trøndelag, 17th-26 May 1975. Trapped. Previously included in Category A (Ree 1976), later moved to Category D following a review by the Norwegian RC (Olsen 2021b).

#### 2. Britain (Scotland) 1980

Adult female, Nethybridge, Badenoch & Strathspey, Highland, 10th-25th March 1980. 2nd British record (Rogers & RC 1981).

Photographs suggest this individual was of the nominate eastern race.

### 'Greenland' Redpoll *Acanthis flammea rostrata*

Following the release of IOC World List version 14.2, Common (Greenland & Mealy), Lesser and Arctic Redpolls were lumped as Redpoll *A. flammea*.

Greenland Redpoll is the southern Greenland, eastern Baffin Island and Icelandic race of Redpoll. Greenland birds depart the breeding grounds towards the end of August with some of these heading southeast to winter in Britain and Ireland, returning from the middle of April to early June (Cramp & Perrins 1994).

### 'Arctic' Redpoll *Acanthis flammea hornemanni* / *exilipes*

Following the release of IOC World List version 14.2, Common (Greenland & Mealy), Lesser and Arctic Redpolls were lumped as Redpoll *A. flammea*.

The former full species, Arctic or Hoary Redpoll *A. hornemanni* was comprised of two subspecies, *hornemanni* (Hornemann's Redpoll) & *exilipes* (Coues's Redpoll), both are now treated as subspecies of Redpoll. Hornemann's Redpoll breeds in northern Greenland and adjacent parts of arctic Canada and is a vagrant to the Western Palearctic where it has reached Great Britain, Ireland and northwest Europe (Cramp & Perrins 1994).

### White-winged Crossbill *Loxia leucoptera leucoptera*

White-winged Crossbill is the Nearctic race of Two-barred Crossbill.

#### 1. Iceland 2017

Male, Seltjörn, between Reykjanesbær and Grindavík, Reykjanes Peninsula, 14th-25th November 2017 (Jones & Robb 2017). Sound recorded. 1st Icelandic record (Sigurðsson *et al.* 2023).

#### 2. Iceland 2018

Female, Selfoss, Árnessýsla, 11th-13th May 2018. 2nd Icelandic record (Sigurðsson *et al.* 2023).

### 3. Iceland 2021

Male, Surtsey, Vestmannaeyjar (Westman Islands), 13th July 2021. 3rd Icelandic record (Sigurðsson *et al.* 2023).

### 4. Azores (São Miguel) 2022

Adult male, Cancela do Cinzeiro, São Miguel, 21st August - 3rd September 2022. Sound recorded. 1st Azores record (Robb *et al.* 2024).

## Pine Siskin *Spinus pinus*

### †. At sea 1962

One came aboard the RMS *Mauritania* at longitude 65°W on 8th October 1962 while she was on passage from New York to European ports and remained to enter the WP at 30°W on 11th October when it was last seen. During the voyage food and water was provided by the crew (Durand 1963).

This species is not on any Western Palearctic national list.

## American Goldfinch *Spinus tristis*

### †. Ireland 1894

Keem Bay, Achill Island, Mayo, 6th September 1894. Shot by J.R. Sheridan of Dugort, Achill Island, who realised he had a similar one in his collection that he had shot while in America in 1873. Sheridan sent it to A.G. More who confirmed the identification as American Goldfinch (Sheridan 1894). Not considered a genuine vagrant and assigned to Category D1 (Preston 1975).

In an addendum to Sheridan's note, J.E. Harting (editor of *The Zoologist*) stated upon examining the specimen ... *and from the much worn appearance of the wing and tail-feathers - the latter especially being much abraded - we are decidedly of opinion that it had been not long previously in captivity.*

This species is not on any Western Palearctic national list.

## Family: **Calcariidae - Longspurs & Snow Buntings**

### **Lapland Longspur** *Calcarius lapponicus subcalcaratus*

There are five subspecies of Lapland Bunting/Longspur found across northern parts of the New and Old Worlds. The form *subcalcaratus* breeds in northern Canada from the mouth of the Mackenzie River east to Greenland and some (presumably birds from Greenland) winter in northwest Europe (Cramp & Perrins 1994).

### **Snow Bunting** *Plectrophenax nivalis nivalis*

There are three subspecies of Snow Bunting breeding across northerly latitudes of the New and Old Worlds (it is the most northerly breeding passerine). The nominate form breeds from the west coast of Alaska east to Greenland, Svalbard and Scandinavia. Some of the southern and western Greenland population winter in northwest Europe (Cramp & Perrins 1994).

Five came aboard the eastbound RMS *Mauritania* in the North Atlantic on 8th October 1962 at longitude 65°W and at least one remained until the ship was approximately 60 nautical miles west of the Fastnet Rock and perhaps as far as Cobh, Cork, Ireland. During the crossing food and water was provided by the ship's crew (Durand 1963, Gantlett & Beadle 1997).

This species is not on any Western Palearctic national list.

### Red Fox Sparrow *Passerella iliaca*

#### 1. Iceland 1944

Male, Laugarholt í Bæjarsveit, 5th November 1944. Collected. 1st Icelandic record (Pétursson & Þráinsson 1999).

The specimen is housed in the Icelandic Institute of Natural History, Reykjavik

#### 2. Northern Ireland 1961

Copeland Islands Bird Observatory, Down, 3rd-4th June 1961 (Gantlett & Beadle 1997, Wilde 1962). Trapped. 1st Irish record (Ruttledge 1962).

#### †. Germany 1949

Mellum Island, Wadden Sea, 15th May 1949 (Barthel & Helbig 2005).

Judged to be ship assisted and assigned to Category E.

#### †. Germany 1977

Scharhörn Island, Wadden Sea, 15th April 1977 (Hartmann 1949).

Judged to be ship assisted and assigned to Category E.

#### †. Denmark 2010

Elkær Plantage, Bindslev, Nordjylland, 5th-9th January 2010 (Neergaard *et al.* 2011).

This bird showed obvious signs of previous captivity and was assigned to Category E.

#### 3. Estonia 2012

Haapsalu, Läänemaa, 2nd-17th December 2012. 1st Estonian record (Ots & Paal 2013).

Subsequently observed at Utö Island, Finland.

#### 3.1 Finland 2012-2013

Utö Island, Västaboland, 20th December 2012 - 3rd April 2013. 1st Finnish record (Lehikoinen *et al.* 2013).

Previously observed at Haapsalu, Estonia.

## **American Tree Sparrow** *Spizelloides arborea*

### **1. Sweden 2016**

Torreberga, Staffanstorp, Skåne, 12th-18th November 2016 (Fors 2017). 1st Swedish record (Wirdheim & Corell 2017).

## **(Slate-coloured) Dark-eyed Junco** *Junco hyemalis hyemalis*

### **1. Ireland 1905**

Loop Head Lighthouse, Clare, 30th May 1905 (Barrington 1906). Shot. 1st Irish record (Rutledge 1961).

The identification was not established until Richard Barrington (author of the *Migration of Birds as Observed at Irish Lighthouses and Lightships*) took the specimen with him to the fourth International Ornithological Congress in London in June 1905 where it was identified by David Seth-Smith (one time editor of the *Avicultural Magazine* and the *Bulletin of the British Ornithologists' Club*). It was not accepted as a genuine vagrant until 1960.

### **†. Italy 1914**

Lazio, 28th November 1914.

Despite the absence of any evidence of previous captivity it was not considered a genuine vagrant (Brichetti & Massa 1984).

### **2. Iceland 1955**

Immature female, Kvísker í Örafum, Austur-Skaftafellssýsla, 6th November 1955 (Ólafsson 1993). Found dead. 1st Icelandic record (Pétursson & Þráinsson 1999).

Skin held at the Icelandic Museum of Natural History, Reykjavik.

### **3. Britain (England) 1960**

Male, Dungeness, Kent, 26th May 1960 (Scott 1976). Trapped. 1st British record (Smith & RC 1971).

Not accepted to Category A until 1971.

### **4. Netherlands 1962**

Male, Overijsselsestraat, Rotterdam, Zuid-Holland, February 1962 (Polder & Voous 1969). Trapped during a blizzard and kept in an aviary until 7th November 1968 when it died. 1st Dutch record (van IJzendoorn *et al.* 1996).

Specimen held at the Natural History Museum, Rotterdam.

### **†. Britain (England) 1962**

Southampton, Hampshire, 14th-15th October 1962 (Durand 1963). Ship assisted individual that arrived on the RMS *Mauretania*, remaining to the following day.

### **5. Poland 1963**

Female, Hel Peninsula, Puck, 4th May 1963 (Busse 1963). Trapped. 1st Polish record.

### **6. Britain (Scotland) 1966**

Male, Foula, Shetland, 1st May 1966. 2nd British record (Smith & RC 1967).

### **7. Britain (Scotland) 1967**

Male, Foula, Shetland, 10th May 1967. 3rd British record (Smith & RC 1968).

### **8. Britain (Scotland) 1969**

Male, Out Skerries, Shetland, 7th May 1969. 4th British record (Smith & RC 1970).

Male, East Rye, Sussex, 12th February 1972. 5th British record (Rogers & RC 1996).

Male, Bardsey Island, Gwynedd, 25th April - 3rd May 1975. Trapped. 7th British record (Dymond & RC 1976).

**12. Britain (England) 1977**

Male, near Rotherham, South Yorkshire, 3rd January 1977. 8th British record (Rogers & RC 1980).

**13. Britain (Scotland) 1977**

Male, Loch Affric, Inverness, 19th May 1977. 9th British record (Rogers & RC 1978).

**14. Britain (England) 1980**

Leman Gas Field, North Sea (53°19'N, 002°37'E, about 30 nautical miles northeast of Cromer, Norfolk in Sea Area Thames), 24th May - 2nd June. 10th British record (Rogers & RC 1982).

The bird was caught, taken ashore to Holme, Norfolk, where it was ringed and released on 31st May. It was last observed on 2nd June.

**15. Denmark 1980**

Male, Skørping, Himmerland, Jutland, 13th December 1980 (Erritzøe & Svenningsen 1996). 1st Danish record (Frich & Nordbjærg 1995).

This bird was caught in a garden while in a weakened state and held in an outdoor aviary for the next twelve years until it died on 18th February 1993.

**†. Britain (England) 1982**

Second calendar-year, Fareham, Hampshire, 3rd-14th February 1982, taken by a cat. Found to be fitted with a plastic ring and therefore deemed to be of suspect origin (Holt *et al.* 2020).

**16. Britain (England) 1983**

Male, Christchurch, Dorset, 20th May 1983. 11th British record (Rogers & RC 1984).

**17. Britain (England) 1983**

Male, Langford Budville, Somerset, 21st May 1983. 12th British record (Rogers & RC 1984).

**18. Britain (England) 1983**

Male, The Lizard, Cornwall, 27th May 1983. 13th British record (Rogers & RC 1984).

**19. Gibraltar 1986**

North Mole, 19th-25th May 1986 (Finlayson & Cortes 1987). Trapped. 1st Gibraltar record ([GONHS Bird List](#) [accessed March 2023]).

This bird was initially judged to be ship assisted and placed in Category D, later reassessed as a genuine vagrant and assigned to Category A.

First-summer male in song, Church Crookham, Hampshire, 30th May - 7th June 1987. 14th British record (Rogers & RC 1990). Also seen in 1988 and 1989 - 1990.

**†. Norway 1987**

Two, Sånnum, Mandal, Agder, 4th December 1987. Originally accepted as a Category A record (Bentz 1989), the record was subsequently reviewed by the Norwegian Rarity Committee and found to be 'not proven'.

**20.1. Britain (England) 1988**

Male in song, Church Crookham, Hampshire, 20th May 1988 and perhaps other dates. 14th British record (Rogers & RC 1990), presumed returning.

**20.2. Britain (England) 1989-1990**

## **White-throated Sparrow** *Zonotrichia albicollis*

Cordeaux had no doubt it was a genuine vagrant and published descriptions in *The Zoologist* (Ser. III, XVII 1893: pp.149-150) and *The Naturalist* (1893: pp.113-114). Nevertheless it was not accepted as a genuine vagrant by the BOU until 2010.

Four were on board a Cunard Line ship that docked at Southampton in October or November 1958. They were captured and taken to East Park Aviary, Southampton, where the last died in January 1964 (Sharrock 1965).

### †. At sea 1961

One was discovered below the ship's bridge structure on the RMS *Queen Elizabeth* on 27th April 1961 when the vessel was approximately 600 nautical miles east-northeast of New York. During the voyage it roosted in the Garden Lounge and was fed by members of the crew. It remained to at least 30th April when she had arrived off the Isles of Scilly. The observer considered it remained until docking at Southampton, and one was found at Needs Oar Point, Hampshire three days later (Durand 1961).

This bird was published in the main body of the 2016 German report, indicating the DAK judged it to be a genuine vagrant and therefore placed in Category A. This species is not on any Western Palearctic national list.

### **Ovenbird** *Seiurus aurocapilla*

Formby, Merseyside, 4th January. Wing found (Smith & RC 1970).

A wing protruding from the flotsam on the tideline at Formby was identified as belonging to an Ovenbird. However the species was not admitted to the British List by the BOU as it could not be established how it got there.

Despite further searches the bird was not observed at Out Skerries after 8th October, however the skipper of a fishing boat departing Skerries on 12th October noticed a strange bird on his deck. From the description he gave it was almost certainly an Ovenbird and was assumed to be the same individual. Unfortunately he did not notice if it carried a ring or not.

First-year, Moore Hall, Lough Carra Forest, Mayo, 8th December 1977 (Wilson 1980). Found dead. 1st Irish record (Preston 1981).

Identified as a first-year of the nominate race by P.J. Morgan (Keeper of Zoology at the National Museum of Wales).
